Nationally renowned leader, 2003 Nobel Peace Prize nominee, environmental justice advocate, author, and speaker, Lois Gibbs, led a heroic, historic, and successful effort to protect her family and community from toxic waste pollution at **Love Canal**, near Niagara Falls, New York, in 1978 to 1980.

Gibbs is an author, winner of the 1990 Goldman Environmental Prize, environmental justice advocate, and the subject of a movie about her life titled, "Lois Gibbs: The Love Canal Story." She has done local and national media interviews or appearances including with Oprah Winfrey and The Today Show.

She has been called "**The Mother of Superfund**," a federal program to clean up toxic waste.
